

Animal Acupuncture And Dry Needling Consent Form

1. What Is Animal Acupuncture / Dry Needling?

Acupuncture and dry needling involve inserting sterile, fine needles into specific points on the animal's body to assist with healing, pain relief, reduced inflammation, muscle relaxation, and improved mobility.

3. Risks and Possible Side Effects

Common minor effects:

- Mild bruising
- Bleeding
- Temporary soreness
- Fatigue
- Increased rest

Rare risks:

- Infection
- Metal allergy
- Pneumothorax (collapsed lung)

4. Preparing for Treatment

Ensure the animal has eaten earlier, toileted, and any medical records are provided. Only sterile, single-use needles are used in this clinic.

5. What to Expect

Your pet may experience a brief prick sensation at needle insertion. Signs of relaxation (yawning, blinking, sleeping) are common. Dry needling may cause a cramping sensation during needle manipulation or muscle twitch response - this demonstrates release of myofascial trigger points. We only use sterile, single-use needles..

6. Aftercare

Temporary soreness or fatigue may occur. Monitor for unusual symptoms and contact your practitioner if anything persists beyond 48 hours or if breathing issues occur after chest-area treatment.
